Summertime is when life runs at a different pace. In July, we watch our gardens grow, waiting for the first fruits and vegetables. In August, we celebrate the ability to finally pick a fresh tomato that we grew. By the end of August, we are finding people to enjoy our abundance. Growing up, July and August were long days watching combines and wheat trucks going past our house with Dad coming in dirty and worn out from driving the tractor. Late August meant a fun-filled few days in Spokane to relax and school shopping.

September means to start getting back into a regular rhythm to our days. Harvest is almost over, the days are getting shorter, and the nights are starting to get cooler. For many, September is also a time for new beginnings. I found an article that spoke about the Jewish observance of Rosh Hashanah, "Head of the Year" which occurs the middle of September. This observance celebrates the sovereignty of God, the creation of humankind, and the relationship between them. Their celebrations include breaking the ritual fast with an apple dipped in honey and wishes for a sweet new year.

This new beginning is followed 10 days later by Yom Kippur, the Day of Repentance, pairing the start of a new year with careful self-examination, penitence, and atonement for wrongdoing. We all need to start fresh periodically, reexamining our choices, and habits, taking responsibility for the ways we have fallen short, reflecting on what went well and what needs to be improved. I know I need to spend time with God in prayer and self-reflection, a time to listen to where He is leading me next.

This article stated that the 10 days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are called the "Days of Awe". Is it because we reflect on our mistakes and realize that in a new beginning, we have another chance to get it right or that we find that new path? Recognizing our faults and accepting responsibility for them helps to make us better people, making a better new start at whatever we undertake.

I pray that you find that time this fall to do some self-reflection. And I pray that we are able as a congregation to do the same, listening to God for direction and purpose in our lives together.
